LETTER FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

2023 was one of the most extraordinary and challenging years for the State of Israel, and by extension, the global People of Israel. The experience of internal political and social unrest led to divisiveness not seen since the Second Temple's destruction almost 2,000 years ago. Despite the challenging environment, Kol Israel stayed true to its goals and values. We worked diligently with our partners to renew the Zionist Movement through the strengthening of the Zionist Federations, offering support to the Zionist youth movements, and creating a base to any Jew who wants to connect to Israel without hyphens or predispositions.

Following the horrific massacre of Israeli civilians along the border with Gaza on October 7th, Kol Israel, the centrist general Zionist faction in the WZO, was quick to act. On day two of this war by organizing a food drive along with our partner Leket Israel, packaging food and additional supplies for our brothers and sisters in the South. By week three of the war, Kol Israel produced an uplifting solidarity tour for our soldiers with leading Israeli artist Idan Reichel along with dozens of volunteers from around the world visiting Israeli army bases in the south.

As part of our efforts to support our brothers and sisters here in Israel and around the world, we launched a weekly Kabbalat Shabbat service led by our own Rabbi Leor Sinai taking place at "Kikar HaChatufim," Hostage Square at the Tel Aviv Museum, and a Daily Briefing bringing the voice of Israel around the globe. A highlight of activity took place in Washington D.C. as leaders and partners of Kol Israel joined the March for Israel on November 14th, sponsored by the Conference of Presidents of Major Jewish Organizations. Together with 300,000 participants we all prayed, sang, and celebrated Am Yisrael.

While our leadership in Israel was doing its best to mobilize on the ground, our partners from around the Jewish world - Zionist Federations, KKL-JNF chapters, our affiliated youth movements (Young Judaea, Hejalutz Lamerjav, FZY, Hanoar Hazioni and Garin Tzabar), StandWithUs and other advocacy organizations, and partners - worked day and night to offer support from Israel and afar and make sure Jewish communities remain safe and proud. They managed fundraisers, arranged equipment drives, had their Israeli staff and volunteers supporting the communities most hurt by the war, volunteered in farms desperately in need of working hands, and much much more.

Now more than ever, people are realizing the connection between anti-Zionism and antisemitism and the centrality of Israel to the Jewish People. As we look towards 2024, we will continue to work together as a network of centrist and United Zionist voices to support Am Yisrael. We thank you, our friends and partners, for your steadfast support as we continue to expand, and look forward to sharing more materials and information. GZG - GENERAL ZIONIST GATHERING

On January 17th-18th, 2023, a select group of Zionist leaders from Israel and the USA met in the background of the IAC's National Summit in Austin, TX, for the first-ever GZG - General Zionist Gathering. The purpose of the gathering was to brainstorm about ways we can reimagine General Zionism in the USA and then across the Jewish world. Over the 2 days, we held discussions led by members of our leadership where we deconstructed the current framework of the Zionist National Institutions to identify

areas where we can leverage our influence to better the lives of Jews and enhance our presence through engagement, collaborations, and effective messaging. In addition, we reviewed our current standing leading up to the next Zionist elections and discussed how we can use existing and new partnerships to bolster our standing. Looking forward, our goal is to hold a larger, global conference in the second half of 2024 where we will host partners from all across the world.





THE EXTRAORDINARY WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

On April 19th-21st, 2023, we were honored to lead a delegation of 30 delegates from the World Confederation of United Zionists and Tnuat Hamerkaz Haliberalit Hanoat Hatzioni – the 2 General Zionist factions – in the gathering of the Extraordinary World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem. During the Congress, our delegates, who took time out of their busy daily lives to fly in from 12 different countries across the globe, participated in invigorating discussions about

the future and function of the Zionist National Institutions and voted on how they will impact the lives of Jews for the next few years. Before the opening of the Congress, we brought our delegates and leadership together for a morning of introductions and brainstorming about the Congress, the future of the Zionist Movement, and our work and presence in the different Jewish communities.

WZO - DEPARTMENT FOR PIONEERING YOUTH AND FUTURE GENERATIONS

This year, our dedicated team, led by Chair Sergio Edelstein and Director Ariel Goldgewicht, continued to support and nurture young Zionist leadership through the WZO Department for Pioneering Youth and Future Generations. First, the department continued to offer budgetary and educational support to WAY - the World Association of Youth Movements. WAY aims to create a global network of young Zionist councils that will offer young leaders a platform to connect and collaborate, thus empowering the Zionist youth movements. In 2023 WAY organized conferences in 4 countries and held activities in many more.

Second, the department ran the 2nd class of ZLA - Zionist Leadership Academy. The Academy is a cutting-edge program that brings together leading 20-35 year old Zionist activists from

around the world to create a tight-knit group of future leaders. The 10-month program includes bi-weekly Zoom sessions which include lectures and activities with leading Zionist thinkers and leaders, and 2 seminars - one abroad and one in Israel.

Third, the Department held the 3rd annual Global Conference on Informal Education and Young Zionist Leadership. The conference brings together the Chanichim of all Zionist youth movements currently in Israel for Shnat Hachshara (Gap Year programs) for a day of content, Ruach, and fostering collaborations. This year's conference hosted over 1,000 teens and was held in conjunction with the Extraordinary World Zionist Congress under the topic of "Jewish and Democratic Israel's 75th Anniversary".





KEREN KAYEMETH LEISRAEL - JEWISH NATIONAL FUND (KKL-JNF)

Our Kol Israel faction has two tireless representatives on the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael - Jewish National Fund (KKL-JNF) Board of Directors - David Yaari, who serves as Vice Chairman; and Nisan Cialic. In 2023, David and Nisan led several important initiatives with a particular emphasis on strengthening the relationship of KKL with global Jewish communities and further expanding KKL's investment in Zionist youth movements.

Specifically, David led the effort to have KKL sponsor the Celebrate Israel parade in NY city. This was the first time KKL partnered with the Parade and was done as part of the 75th anniversary for Israel. This initiative was overwhelmingly supported by the board of KKL.

Similarly, in 2022 David, along with fellow KKL Board Member Daniel Avidor, embarked on a long term strategic process to enhance cooperation and partnership between KKL-JNF and JNF-USA. David and Dani enlisted support from several key partners on KKL's board and professional staff in order to mend the relationship between these two great organizations and forge a path forward of reconciliation and collaboration. Following discussions between representatives of both boards, in December 2023, David led a senior delegation from KKL's leadership to attend JNF-USA's National Conference in Denver, CO where the two organizations announced their intention

to establish a \$50 million joint fund that will be used to build back in Southern Israel.

A third effort accomplished this year is a unique initiative called "We're Still Standing." On January 24th, 2024, just before International Holocaust Remembrance Day, KKL-JNF, in partnership with the Israeli Mission to the UN and the Claims Conference, will host an exhibition at the UN Headquarters in New York City celebrating the life of Holocaust survivors. The exhibition will feature photos taken of the survivors in recent years, a screening of a movie telling the story of Holocaust survivors who lived through the October 7th massacre, and the launch of a new book entitled "The Power of Life" that includes photos and texts describing and celebrating their lives.

Lastly as the events of October 7th began to unfold, the role of civilian defense/emergency response quads "Kitot Konenut", was critical in defending the Kibbutzim and Moshavim who were under attack. Within a few days of October 7th, our representatives, David and Nisan, joined with fellow KKL board members to push for immediate support and financing of the municipalities to strengthen the Kitot Konenut. KKL-JNF has so far extended over 42 million Shekels to support these squads and ensure that they can retrain, restock and continue defending civilian homes and by extension, Jewish homeland.

THE WORLD ZIONIST EXECUTIVE – FEDERATIONS COMMITTEE

Since the 2020 Zionist Congress, we have campaigned for the establishment of a Zionist Federations Committee under the Zionist Executive. We believe that the Zionist Federations play a critical role in strengthening the Jewish communities around the world and maintaining their connection with Israel. We felt that there was a growing detachment between the Federations and the National Institutions and therefore there's a need for a dedicated body whose role is to bridge that gap and determine how the two sides can better cooperate and collaborate.

In early 2023 our campaign finally bore fruit – the committee was formed and our representative on the Zionist Executive, Olga Israel Deutsch, was named Chair. Since its establishment, the committee held several meetings, analyzed the current relationship between the Federations and the Institutions, and put forth ideas and resolutions destined to bolster the Federations' involvement in the Institutions' activities and

programs, with an emphasis on allocating additional budgetary support. In parallel, Olga and her committee members worked with the different Institutions to ensure that they reached out to the Federations and actively engaged them.

During the Extraordinary Zionist Congress, the committee organized a meeting of all attending heads of Federations to discuss joint challenges and successes, strategize together, exchange information about relevant activities, and coordinate efforts. Following the meetings, the committee created a WhatsApp group that, for the first time, created a communications platform between the leadership of the different Federations. Finally, following October 7th, the committee has been working with the Federations to identify ways to offer support and funds to help them with their key role in combatting antisemitism and supporting Israel from afar.





JAFI - SUBCOMMITTEE ON THE ABSORPTION OF YOUTH ALIYAH

Our board member, Rabbi Leor Sinai, is the head of JAFI's Subcommittee on the Absorption of Youth Aliyah. In 2023, the subcommittee, as part of the Aliyah Committee, has been working tirelessly to promote Aliyah, especially among the younger generation, and support new Olim as they make their first steps in Israel.

Since October 7th, the committee has led the evacuation of 2,200 Olim who were living in location centers within rocket range in Israel's north and south and established new youth-

directed programs in four of the centers that are now working with 300 Olim. In addition, the committee distributed 1000 Tablets to assist young Olim with their studies as they acclimate to Israel, Hebrew and their new lives. In addition, we ensured 24/6 support for olim by offering assistance for whatever needs the olim encountered in the process. Finally, it recruited additional personnel to offer recreational activities to the Olim including hiking, sports, and volunteering.





KOL ISRAEL RESPONDS TO OCTOBER 7TH

PARTNERSHIP WITH LEKET ISRAEL - DELIVERING CARE PACKAGES

Just two days after the horrifying attacks of October 7th, Kol Israel jumped into the fray and joined the incredible civil mobilization that swept across Israel. As our first effort, we decided to join our partners at Leket Israel to bring together a team of dedicated volunteers in creating care packages for our soldiers on the battlefield and those injured in the attack.

To say we were overwhelmed by the response and willingness is an understatement. Within hours we filled the quota of volunteers who the

next day created no less than 600 packages filled with sweets, snacks, and essential equipment, all in support of those most affected. The volunteers were taken by buses to the IDF's Southern Command and Soroka Hospital in Be'er Sheva where they were given the opportunity to personally deliver packages to those soldiers and civilian victims who were visibly elated and strengthened by the visit. The whole effort was a true manifestation of one of our core values, Areivut Hadadit (Mutual Responsibility).





SUPPORTING OUR SOLDIERS – LAND, AIR, AND SEA

Following the immense success of our Care Packages day, our leadership felt there was a need to refocus our efforts on those who without their daily sacrifices, we wouldn't be here today; the amazing soldiers of the IDF. We decided to organize a day of morale boosting in three remote army bases in Israel's south, following the words of the prayer for the safety of the IDF. **בַּיָּבֵשָׁה, בַּיָּמִינִים וּבַיָּם** (soldiers in land, air, and sea). We partnered with internationally acclaimed Israeli musician Idan Raichel who donated his time to perform this mitzvah. Given the impending winter season, we added winter gear to keep our soldiers warm, snacks to keep them fed, and finally – a huge BBQ to make sure we give them a truly memorable night of fun and gratitude from Kol Israel, Jewish people from all over the world including our volunteers from North and South America, Europe and Israel who joined us for the day.

And so, on October 31st, we loaded our bus with goods and volunteers and headed south. In a day that started at 6 AM in Tel Aviv and ended in the small hours of the night, we traveled to 3 army bases – the Shizafon Tank Brigades base, the Ovda Airbase, and the Eilat Naval base – where in each Idan and his band performed for the soldiers (sometimes more than once per base!) and we handed out the snacks and equipment. But perhaps the most touching part of the day was Rotem Kalederon. Rotem, an inspiring teen from the Gaza Envelope, had his father, sister, and brother kidnapped by Hamas on October 7th. But Rotem, who dreams of becoming a professional drummer, decided to take his pain and invest it in supporting our soldiers. In each base, Rotem joined Idan on stage and performed for the soldiers. To see the love and support showered by the soldiers on this brave young man, who suffered a truly horrifying fate, was immensely uplifting. Check out this [video](#) depicting the day's events.

DAILY BRIEFINGS

Within a week of the start of the war, we recognized a strong need for a steady, reliable source of information for world Jewry to navigate the unbelievably difficult situation in both Israel and the rest of the Jewish world. So, under the leadership of our board member Rabbi Leor Sinai and Secretary General Aaron Weil, we organized a series of daily webinars where we hosted experts from every relevant walk of life. These included leading pro-Israel advocates Joanna Landau and Ido Aharoni; Jon Polin whose son, Hersh Goldberg-Polin, is still a hostage in the Gaza Strip; CEO of the Conference of Presidents William Daroff; leaders of Kol Israel; and a long list of leading activists and thinkers. The webinars, attended by thousands over a two-month period, offered unique perspectives into the situation in Israel and abroad and served as a gateway for Jews from around the world to stay engaged.

SHABBAT SERVICES IN KIKAR HACHATUFIM - HOSTAGES SQUARE



Beyond the immense human loss of all those murdered on October 7th, one of the greatest tragedies of that day was the staggering number of kidnapped citizens and soldiers, many of whom are still held in subhuman conditions in the Gaza Strip. The movement calling for their immediate release, led by the families of the hostages, has designated a central square in Tel Aviv – formerly known as Habimah Square – as Kikar Hachatufim, the Hostage Square. The square is used as a gathering place for the families and their supporters and has become the movement’s focal point. Every week since October 7th, the families have been holding a Kabbalat Shabbat at the square, where they welcome the weekend but also remind every person participating and walking by that the battle for the return of their loved ones is far from finished. Our amazing board member, Rabbi Leor Sinai, has been leading these services every week without fail and will continue to do so until all the hostages are home.



ISRAEL FOOD RESCUE

Kol Israel volunteer Rabbi Randy Brown of Washington DC, with inspiration from Kol Israel board member Shula Bahatof NYC, launched an immediate response to the crisis called "Israel Food Rescue". The mission of this initiative is to empower diaspora Jews to come to Israel and work the soil in place of the thousands of agricultural workers who had left the country following the attacks of October 7th. Committed to staying for two to four weeks, the volunteers became a reliable workforce, skilled in the requirements of the farms. This longer program had a much greater impact and value for the farmers than day-long volunteer programs and made a huge impact on Israel's struggling agricultural sector in the south which is home to

a large portion of Israel's domestic food growing capacity.

The first mission arrived on November 22, a group of 14 from six nations around the globe, ranging from 18 to 76 years of age. To date, more than 169 volunteers have participated, working on four different farms and specializing in the crops they grow and package. Daily averages reached 4.4 tons of fruit picked and 5,502 pieces of fruit packed per person. Equally meaningful is the impact the mission has on the farmers and others who hear of it. Responses like "You are our backbone" and "You're not helping us; you're saving us" demonstrate the true value of the mission.

MOBILIZATION IN FEDERATIONS AND COMMUNITIES

NEW ZEALAND

Our Kol Israel delegate, Rob Berg, is the chairman of JNF New Zealand and former head of the New Zealand Zionist Federation. Since October 7th, JNF NZ has been collaborating and working closely with several groups in New Zealand, including 'Shalom New Zealand' (a group representing Israeli ex pats in NZ), Habonim Dror, B'nai Akiva, and a variety of Christian Zionist Groups. Together, they orchestrated several crucial activities, including raising funds to send tourniquets to the IDF, fundraising for the KKL-JNF War Relief Fund, several vigils for the kidnapped Israelis, and a rally for Israel.





ZIONIST FEDERATION OF DENMARK

Following the heinous terrorist attack on October 7th, the Danish Zionist Association together with the Danish Zionist Federation headed by Kol Israel Delegate Max Meyer, has been busy daily influencing the media and the public to understand the conflict from the Israeli side. There have been many demonstrations in support of Israel and events to draw attention to the hostages. A major event was a memorial service held in Copenhagen's synagogue, in the presence of Denmark's Queen Margrethe the Second. The event was held with a full synagogue and a highly popular live broadcast screened on the national Danish television and included remarks from the Danish Prime Minister and Foreign Minister.

TNUAT HAMERKAZ HALIBERALIT HANOAR HATZIONI (TH4)

A critical part of the Kol Israel faction is Tnuat Hamerkaz Haliberalit Hanoar Hatzioni (lovingly nicknamed TH4) – the political wing of Hanoar Hatzioni in the World Zionist Congress. TH4 have been incredibly busy in 2023. Its leadership visited Hanoar's sister movements around the world (nine and counting!), offering guidance and mentorship to the amazing Zionist educators leading their activities on the ground. TH4's political forum – the body that dictates its

strategy and practices – held conferences in the movement's different branches and conducted introductory sessions for all those interested in shaping its future. Finally, since October 7th, members and partners of Hanoar around the world have taken part and led activities in their communities and cities, working to raise funds, leading rallies, and lobbying for the release of all hostages.





STANDWITHUS

Since October 7th, StandWithUs has reached over 500 Million people on Instagram alone and nearly 1 Billion through all social media platforms, educating about Israel and fighting antisemitism around the world. Additionally, since the first day of the war, it hosted a weekly emergency briefing together with the IDF that features expert analysis which is viewed weekly by 400,000 people. It supported solidarity rallies with printed signs and security for rally participants and helped coordinate more billboard campaigns than ever before across the US. It has also helped to coordinate shipments of key equipment to Israel with medical supplies, equipment for reservists, and humanitarian aid.

At the same time, the StandWithUs campus and high school teams have been supporting far more students than ever before. Every day the team receives reports from students who are being bullied or are concerned about their administrations turning a blind eye to the blatant, rising antisemitism on their campuses and high schools. The IsraelLINK Team responded with educational resources focusing on Israel's resilience through the ages. Lastly, the StandWithUs Saidoff Legal Department has received requests for help with over 600 incidents since October 7th, with this number rising every single day.

FZY - FEDERATION OF ZIONIST YOUTH

FZY is one of the oldest centrist Zionist youth movements and our amazing partner in the UK. Since the beginning of the war, FZY's staff in Israel and across Britain led amazing initiatives to support Israel and British Jewry. These include activities for its Bogrim community (university students) to help with information and emotional

processing, an in-person evening of prayer and reflection in London for FZY's older members and alumni, a fundraising campaign linked to the UJIA's Emergency War Appeal, a letter-writing campaign to Members of Parliament to put pressure on them to do what they can to help return the hostages, and many many more.





HEJALUTZ LAMERJAV

Hejalutz Lamerjav is one of our main partner movements in Latin America. The movement continued its educational efforts throughout the year in both Latin America and Israel. In Argentina, beyond the weekly activities in 14 cities nationwide, the Chanichim and Madrichim (leaders), supported by three Israeli emissaries, concluded the year with the Majané Kaitz (summer camp) for children aged 10 and older. Starting October 7th, the Movement's focus shifted to issues related to the war. Memorial events for the fallen were held in each city, along with special projects like visiting the parents of lone soldiers.

In Israel, Hechalutz Lamerchav operates in two main ways. First, participants of the Gap Year program arrived in Israel for a year-long training. Throughout 2023, they traveled across Israel, volunteered in various social programs, and studied at the Machon leMadrichim (Leaders' Institute). Additionally, post-October 7th, the Movement engaged with its olim, particularly in volunteering for social initiatives and supporting lone soldiers, including organizing donations.

DORSHEI TORAH VITZION

Dorshei Torah V'Tzion (DTT) is our sister movement in the USA, representing a wide range of liberal orthodox organizations and unions. Since the breakout of the war, DTT's network arranged a wide range of activities. YCT (Yeshivat Chovevei Torah) organized a mission for rabbinical students to Israel, providing material and spiritual support to displaced communities, families of hostages, and those injured; creating new programs to train Rabbanim and Rabbaniyot to respond to the needs of displaced populations; and offering grants to students and alumni to join missions to Israel.

JOFA, the Jewish Orthodox Feminist Alliance, partnered with JFNA on the "blue ribbon"

campaign to raise awareness for the hostages, ran an op-ed writers workshop to train women to write about their experience as women living abroad and their support for Israel as well as addressing the rise of antisemitism, co-sponsored a rally in front of the UN in the lead up to the "Hear Our Voices Event" later that day, and more. Finally, the International Rabbinic Fellowship (IRF) made numerous trips to Israel where they visited those affected by the atrocities. Alongside that, its rabbis are on the frontlines in combating campus antisemitism working either with or through their campus Hillels. In addition, they are mobilizing their communities in several efforts including volunteering, raising money and attending rallies and vigils to support Israel.





YOUNG JUDAEA

Young Judaea has been a long time partner of Kol Israel, serving as a strong General Zionist voice in the Jewish youth movement landscape in the USA. One of the key initiatives in which its members participated this year was the pilot AZYC Teen Leaders Israel Summit at the Z3 Project Conference. According to national director Adina Frydman, it was an absolutely incredible experience for all of the participants - teens and professionals alike. 35 teen leaders

and 14 educators came together in Palo Alto representing 10 different North American Zionist youth movements for a day of learning, bonding, and building. Kol Israel played a crucial role in assisting Young Judaea in securing the funds necessary for its participation, as part of our ongoing dedication to promoting the Zionist youth movements and training the next generation of dedicated Zionist leaders.
